Panopto Visit with Lecture Capture Committee 12/12/19

Those Present: Troy Carroll (WCTL), Rodger Ling (Nursing), Sarah Canatsey (RCOB), Titus Albu (Chemistry and Physics), Natalie Haber (Library), Donnie Behneman (Academic Affairs), Dawn Ford (WCTL)

Two Panopto representatives (Jeff Dennis and Andy Tunis) came to UTC's campus and explained the features and benefits of the solution and responded to guestions from the committee.

Jeff and Andy met individually with Titus Albu, Mike Roeser (Engineering), and Dawn Ford and Troy Carroll before meeting with the committee. All committee members were invited.

Jeff also explained that he would be extending our Panopto trial through the Spring 2020 semester while we are planning to evaluate Kaltura (another lecture capture product). This will be beneficial for a fair comparison.

These are the main points presented:

- Panopto has an integration with Canvas videos are made available to students via their Canvas courses
- All content is authenticated content. Panopto/Canvas users can only see those videos they are allowed to see based on permissions
- Can schedule lecture capture
- Can use multiple cameras
- There is a phone app to start/stop recording
- Videos can be viewed live and on-demand
- Video and audio files can be uploaded playback on any device
- Videos are indexed for smart search
- Videos are accessible automated speech results for captioning and transcript
- Quiz feature that is integrated with Canvas gradebook can add multiple choice, true/false, multiple answer, and fill in the blank questions to videos
- Panopto can migrate content from Mediasite to Panopto
- Takes about 10 minutes to upload a 1-hour video so that's it's ready for students to view
- Threaded discussion can be added to a video
- Private notes can be added to a video
- Integration with Zoom
 - Requires Zoom cloud recording option
- Analytics are available
- Video editing with HTML 5
 - New simplified editor is in beta; to be released soon
 - There is a beta Panopto web application so that the user doesn't have to install Panopto on their device to do recording
- Can save videos to personal folders
- Can create playlists
- Students can create videos
- In classrooms, Panopto can work through the Extron which is connected to mics and cameras. An "easy button" can be used to launch Panopto or the faculty can use their phone app.

- Unlimited storage
- Cost is approximately the same as Mediasite
 - Mediasite storage is extremely limited. Would have to purchase much more to expand to campus; especially student use
 - o Mediasite recorders and support fees are more expensive
 - O While Panopto is about the same cost, you are getting much more for the money
