

Instructor Tutorial: Peer Review Assignments

This tutorial will review how to create and manage a peer assignment and how to view student peer reviews. It will also go over what peer reviews look like in student view.

To Create a Peer Review Assignment


- Create the assignment.
- In the assignment settings, check to require peer reviews.



• You can manually assign peer reviews or have Canvas automatically assign the peer reviews.




• If you select to have Canvas automatically assign peer reviews, select how many reviews each student will complete. In addition, please select a date to assign the reviews. If the date is left blank, Canvas will assign reviews on the assignment due date.






• If you would like to hide student names on the submissions, you can select to have the peer reviews appear anonymously. **NOTE:** Anonymous peer reviews will deactivate the document annotation for both the teacher and student reviewers.




• Save the assignment.

To Manage the Peer Reviews

- Open the assignment.
- Click Peer Reviews on the right.




To manually assign a peer review, use the plus sign to assign a submission to review.




Select a name from the dropdown list.



• Click Add.



- If automatically assigned, you will see the peer review assigned under the student name.
- If the student has not completed the peer review, you will see an exclamation point.
- If the student has completed the peer review, you will see a check mark.




• To send a reminder to the student to complete a peer review, click the bell icon.






Student View


• Student will open the assignment to see what review he is assigned.



• If the instructor has left any feedback, or if they wish to annotate on the assignment, they can click the *View Feedback* link.








• Student can add a comment.






- If there is a rubric, the student is required to complete the rubric.
- They will click *Show Rubric*.




• They will see a checkmark next to the peer review when it is complete.






To View Student Peer Reviews

• Click on the Student Name.



- You will see the student's comments on the right.
- You will see annotations on the document.



• To review the peer reviewed rubric, click *Show Rubric*.





• Select the student name from the dropdown.
