Hacking the New History Curriculum:

How to complete your major under the old rules, while using the new system.

How far along are you in your History Major?

- If you haven't completed very many credits towards your degree, consider changing your catalog year to 2016-17. This will move you into the new major and allow you to benefit from our new and improved curriculum.
- If you've completed most of the basics for your degree (rising junior, junior or senior), here are the substitutions that will let you meet your requirements under your current catalog year:
 - ➤ If you need World Civ (old HIST1010, 1020, and/or HIST1030): Take the new two-part World Civ sequence (HIST1110 and HIST1120) and a 2000-level survey in the European or World Histories categories
 - ➤ If you need HIST3010 (Seminars in History): Take our new capstone seminar, HIST4020
 - ➤ If you need to meet your 4000-level seminar requirement: Take any new 4000-level course EXCEPT the following: HIST4020 (capstone seminar); HIST4920 (internships in history); or HIST4998 (individual studies).
