Minutes: The minutes for the November meeting were distributed and approved electronically.

Blue Ribbon Award: Valara Samples, Housing & Residence Life, was the recipient of the Chancellor's Blue Ribbon Award for October 2020. Craig Gosnell, Campus Rec, was the recipient of the Chancellor's Blue Ribbon Award for November 2020.

Guest: Stacie Grisham, Assistant Vice Chancellor for Student Success, Enrollment Management and Student Affairs

Ms. Grisham gave a presentation on the UT Promise Scholarship. Some of the highlights from the presentation were:

What is the UT Promise Scholarship?

- 1. New undergraduate last-dollar scholarship that covers tuition and mandatory fees (launched Fall 2020)
- 2. Eligible entering freshmen must qualify for HOPE and have a family household income is under \$50,000 a year in addition to other requirements
- 3. Student-success oriented program that requires volunteer service hours and meeting with a mentor each semester

Fall 2020 Demographics for UTC Promise Recipients:

There were 448 total recipients with the average award amount being \$144

- Gender:
 - o 69% Female
 - o 31% Male
- Population:
 - o 65% first-time college students

- o 30% returning students
- o 5% transfer
- Race/Ethnicity
 - o 60% White
 - o 22% Black or African American
 - o 6% Hispanic/Latino
 - o 4% Multiple Values
 - o 3% Asian

The top counties with UTC Promise Recipients:

- 28% Hamilton
- 7% Shelby
- 6% each Davidson & Knox
- 5% Rutherford

Community Service:

Community service is time contributed to a nonprofit or public service organization. There are some general common guidelines for service for the program including:

- Students cannot be paid
- Students cannot be supervised by someone who is a family member.
- Students can volunteer with more than one organization to meet their eight-hour requirement.
- Travel time to and from destinations does not count as service.
- Make sure your service aligns with your UT campus service guidelines

All UT Promise recipients must complete 8 hours of community service. The community service submission deadlines are:

- Spring term December 1
- Summer term April 1
- Fall term July 1

The most frequent service opportunities submitted for UTC students this fall were:

- Chattanooga Area Food Bank (88)
- Chattanooga Community Kitchen (39)
- Chambliss Center for Children (23)
- Orange Grove Center (10)
- Scrappy's Cupboard, Erlanger and a number of other food banks, churches & schools

Over 200 site locations were reported on over 650+ submissions.

Mentors:
