# RN-BSN Gateway Nursing Curriculum

The RN-BSN coursework consists of eight classes (27 credit hours). You will take one Gateway class at a time, two per semester. Cohorts begin in August and January of each year.

NURS 4500/4555 Community Health Nursing course has a clinical component.

Each student will be advised on what general education credits they need by the Gateway Advisor after receiving acceptance to UTC as an undergraduate transfer student, and having submitted transcripts for evaluation. Admission to the university, graduation from an accredited diploma or associate degree nursing program, a current RN license, and a minimum GPA of 2.0 meets the requirements for admission to the RN-BSN concentration.
